One thing to come out of our conversations was to check that parents have their username and password for connecting to the **parent portal** via our website. #### ACADEMIC CONFERENCING Tuesday and Wednesday, MARCH 30 & 31

Letters will be both emailed and posted to you to ensure that every family is aware of the upcoming evening. You will be invited, along with your student, to a 20-minute in-depth discussion with their Learning Advisor. This academic progress planning meeting will include discussion around:

- Initial Report (available at the meeting)
- The student's short term and long term plans
- The student's attendance patterns thus far in 2021
- NCEA credit printout (Year 12 & 13 students only)
- Other matters arising from College or home

We will be halting normal classes so these meetings can occur. Academic planning meetings will take place from 1.00 pm until 5.00 pm and from 6.00 pm until 8.00 pm on Tuesday 30 March and 1.00 pm until 5.00 pm on Wednesday 31 March. Normal school classes will conclude at 12.15 pm on these days with lunch.

If you have two or more children at the College, you will most likely find that you have two or more copies of this letter with a unique appointment time for each child. We will group your appointments together so that you only have to make one journey.

You will find enclosed a letter that, if required, you can share with your employer, requesting a little time off from your normal work in order to attend this important meeting.

Students are expected to attend their interviews and will, therefore, be able to escort you to the correct room. We ask you to please return the tear-off slip from the letter you will receive confirming that you and your student will be attending and ask students to return it to their Learning Advisor by Wednesday 24 March at the latest.

Please note that if you are unable to attend, there is still an expectation that students will attend. School uniform is not required to be worn.

We believe that these meetings will have a significant impact in helping sustain the positive partnership that exists between the students, their parents/caregivers, and the school.

In previous years, approximately 80% percent of all families were able to attend and feedback shows that they found the meetings very valuable. The stronger this relationship is the more we are all able to help students to achieve their goals.
