
PRINCIPAL'S COMMENTS

I'm thrilled with the success of our Evolocity team and their win in Palmerston North this week. After competing against teams from our region and beyond they came out on top. My congratulations to Ivan Du Plessis, Joel Dunwoodie, Matthew Willans, Ivan Dunford, and Samuel Schroder.

While we are rapidly approaching the end of instructional lessons and internal assessments for Senior students, who will be on exam level in 3 weeks' time, the level of progress being maintained by these students is quite exceptional.

Our projected results for Years 11, 12 and 13 are looking extremely positive and I thank staff and students for staying the course with our plan for the return to school and the end of the year. We are not there quite yet and I am encouraging everyone to finish well and I think you will agree that what we are on track to achieve is extraordinary.



EVolocity in partnership with Orion, ETCO, University of Auckland, University of Canterbury and MeloYelo has proudly launched the school's programme for the seventh year of competition. The programme now extends from Canterbury through to Nelson, Wellington, Waikato, Manawatu, Wanganui, Wairarapa, Horowhenua, Bay of Plenty and Auckland schools.

What is EVolocity?

EVolocity is about fast forwarding the future. It's about stimulating innovation and growing awareness of the advantages of electric transport in a sector which may be the global growth sector of the 21st Century. Our High School initiative provides students with an electric bike componentry kit. During the course of the year they design & build their own electric vehicles. At the end of the year they bring their vehicles to a motorsport park for some fun competitions!

There were 2 categories where schools can take part in EVolocity, namely standard class and open class (Bikes & Carts). For the first time in this competition, Naenae college took took part in the Standard class: Carts up to 350W, (for the 24V Standard Kit).
























Track Zero Programme

During the school holidays, a group of seven young creative rangatahi attended the Track Zero programme that focused on climate change. The students learnt about climate science from New Zealand's Top scientist Tim Naish and explored actions they can take to create a resilient, carbon neutral future. The students also actively took part in photography workshops led by local artists Chevron Hassett, Te Kawa Robb and Te Rawhitiroa Bosch (joined in via Zoom from Auckland). The photographers shared their expertise and taught them how to use digital cameras to produce photos that express their ideas on our place, our world, and the impact of climate change on their communities. Students were lucky enough to go out on a field trip with the artists to take photos. At the end of the workshop students were gifted the cameras by the Track Zero team.

The students' photographs will be exhibited in the Naenae community centre and New Zealand Festival of Arts 2022.
