Kia ora e Te Whānau

Our senior students have been busy studying for exams and finishing off any last pieces of work. The feedback from the staff who run our exam centre has been positive and there have been lots of comments about the kotahitanga our students have shown to the exam supervisors. The junior students have carried on with their mahi and have also shown kotahitanga working with staff and others to keep learning despite the temptation to 'ease up' that often happens at this stage of the year.

Next week, we have our Education Outside the Classroom activities. The purpose of these activities is to provide students with access to hands-on experiences that are not available inside the classroom. They offer unique and stimulating learning opportunities that support skills such as confidence, leadership, resilience, self-awareness, empathy and self-esteem. Activities on offer this year range from overnight camps, movies, day walks, mountain biking and fishing, as well as cultural experiences. I trust students will make the most of these opportunities and demonstrate what Te Whānau Tahi looks like to all those who come in contact with our community.

The Board of Trustees (BOT) and our staff have been focusing and planning for 2024. Our teacher-only day focused on changes required with new NCEA Level 1 requirements; the essence of these changes requires staff to consider how best to engage our students with the new NCEA Achievement Standards. The other main mahi being worked on by the BOT and staff has been improving attendance and raising classroom expectations. The evidence in education research (and what we know to be true) is that for students to be at their best, they need to attend classes regularly, and we need to expect them to arrive ready to learn. We here at Naenae believe that ALL students are capable of success and that the two key indicators of success are being present and having high expectations.

Another key work-on for us as a kura is our communication with home. I am aware that we can do better with many aspects of our communication, and to that end, we have purchased an application that we will roll out at the start of next year. This new app, "Schoolbridge", has a number of features that we think will help us improve our communications. These include:

- Report student absence from school via the app
- Allow access to the app, parent portal, forms, newsletters and information with one password

• This password will be using an existing service you may already have, such as Google, Microsoft, or Facebook sign-on.

Finally, have a great Christmas and New Year. I hope you all get a chance to reconnect with friends and whānau. I am looking forward to spending time with my whānau and some much-needed time relaxing in the sun. Here's hoping the Wellington weather will come to the party.
