Finally, a few weeks ago, I sent out attendance data and I would like to take the time to explain what some of this means. The percentage of attendance sent out is calculated by the Ministry of Education (MOE), not the school. For attendance purposes, a student is either in school or not in school. Per the MOE guidelines on attendance, the reason for a student not being in school is not considered. As a school, we understand that there are a variety of reasons students cannot be at school, and this is defined as 'justified' or 'unjustified'. It is important to remember that we also do not have control over these codes; these are also set by the Ministry. What we as a college do know is that the more you are in school and in class, the better your chances of success will be. In term two, I will send this data out again, BUT this time I will report to you only the 'unjustified' codes. These are the areas that we are all looking to improve on, and I will encourage you to have conversations at home about how you can support this important mahi.
