A special mention goes to our teachers, Tiria Tiria and Whaea Verna Kohunui, who put in so many hours with our students to provide them with an awesome opportunity to celebrate their culture.
- I had the privilege of hearing our Te Whānau Tahi choir perform at the big sing competition in the Michael Fowler Centre. They were awesome and were a real credit to our kura. A special thanks to Victoria Ferguson, who spent so many hours with our students to again provide this opportunity.

I would like to finish off this newsletter by discussing the students' response to our locking of the bathrooms a couple of weeks ago. I have been very pleased with the students' response. We have seen a significant improvement in attitude and respect towards our facilities. Therefore, at the start of the term, we will go back to the bathrooms being unlocked throughout the day. We will still be insisting on students only being out of class for valid reasons, as the priority should always be on students in class getting on with their schoolwork. I will be thanking our students for their efforts and encouraging them to keep up this level of respect in our end-of-term assembly.


