Over the last few weeks, we have had some amazing events in the kura to celebrate our students. Perhaps the one thing that shone through with all these events is how amazing our students are. We have some great students here and the community should be proud of all our young people. When I reflect back on my first year here as Principal I can see a huge increase in two key areas. The first one is the increase in student participation in both extra-curricular and in classroom efforts. The second is in the increase in positive student engagement as a cultural norm. I am pleased to see such growth in our students and hope that this trend continues as we look for continuous improvement over the coming years.

In my letter to the community at the start of the term I mentioned the landscaping and re-roofing projects that were starting. These have been moving alone at pace and while I appreciate the disruption this has caused; I look forward to the positive impacts this will have once that work is completed.

On the issue of school lunches I can confirm that we have been allocated a new provider with a contract for 2025 and 2026. This is a positive move as we will have free lunches for our students. However, this issue is far from resolved as there are now question marks about the quality and quantity of the meals that will be provided at \$3 per head. I am not confident that with this amount we will get the correct nutritional requirements our students need. There are also questions being raised about the delivery and pick up process for these meals. It looks like to cut the cost of this program the government is forcing the schools to manage the logistics of this at their own cost. I am currently asking some questions of the government and hope to have some more answers soon.

Finally, we have had exciting news about the re-opening of the Naenae Pool. The official date is 4 December and we have been invited to be a part of the opening and blessing. I will provide more details when I have more information.
