It is crucial that whānau and students understand the importance of these assessments. If you do not pass these, you will be unable to gain any of your NCEA level certificates. In the testing during term two we had a high number of senior students not attend these assessments. We can do our best to prepare students to sit theses assessments, but we need your support to ensure students are prepared for these assessments. We suggest the following as ways you can assist:

• Attendance at school is crucial

- Those students who read at home are more likely to achieve the assessments
- Encourage the use of capital letters and writing in full sentences
- Learning of times tables e.g. recite them at the dinner table, while driving around in the car
- Encourage the use of math in the home e.g. measurements while baking, percentages while shopping, etc.
- Email the teachers to ask them what they need to work on.
