Sitting here writing this newsletter I am noticing the change in the temperature, the seasonal change to autumn has meant some much-needed cooler days and nights. With this comes a reminder that as the temperature goes down students need to be prepared with the correct school uniform. Students can wear either our hoodie, jersey or blazer. We have a wide range of clothing items and expect all students to wear our uniform with pride. Students look super smart when they wear our uniform well. At our recent Board of Trustees meeting a college vest was approved as part of the uniform. If students can not wear our uniform for any reason, we are happy to issue a temporary uniform pass but only if this comes with an accompanying note from home. On 18 and 19 March we are holding our Learning Conferences. The school closes early on those days to provide an opportunity for home, student and school to discuss our common shared goals for the year. This is an important meeting, so we can collaborate and ensure students are given every opportunity to be as successful as they can be. We already have similar numbers of bookings as last year and would like to supersede those results so encourage you to get on SchoolBridge and book. Congratulations to 118 parents of year nine students who have already booked as the highest percentage group in the kura.

Attendance at school is still a major factor in success academically. Generally, the math is simple. The more you attend the better your chances of success. While we have had some improvement in attendance rates there is still a lot of work to do. Please be conscious that even sickness, family events and overseas trips mean students are not in class. If our student's attendance is 80% that still means they have missed one day of learning a week. That can add up to over 40 days missed a year. Attendance of less than that is very difficult to catch up so I would like to encourage you to reach out to the school so we can see what support we can offer.

Kia ora,

The Vibe Health Clinic is open for 2025 at Naenae College. Students and whānau can book their own appointments at student services. All services and prescriptions are free.

Clinic times available may be subject to change throughout the year but we will ensure that the school and students are well informed if this is the case.

- We have a doctor on Wednesdays, Dr. Emily Cavana

If you would like to book an appointment, you can always call through to student services or email us on <u>SBHS@vibe.org.nz</u>, with the student's name and school in the heading. The team will then book them in or contact you if needed.

WELLBEING CHECK IN WITH YEAR 9s

We will be seeing all Year 9 students for a "Wellbeing Check-in". This is an opportunity for students to check out the health clinic and meet the nurses. It is a place where students and their whānau can talk with our nurses about anything that may assist in the early detection of any health concerns or support with transitioning into secondary school.

The Wellbeing Check-ins are optional, and students and their whanau can decline to have these, you can contact us via email: <u>SBHS@vibe.org.nz</u> - include the student's name and which school they attend, and we won't call them through, however you, and the student can still request to be seen at any other time.

The team are available for all sorts of health interventions, this includes injuries, ACC, vision and hearing checks, brief intervention and support, physical assessments, skin infections, support with chronic conditions such as asthma and eczema.

Vibe youth health service is open during school holidays and students are more than welcome to be seen by the Primary Health Team at Vibe in Lower Hutt or Upper Hutt. Please call us on 0800242828 to arrange an appointment or to speak to the Primary Health Team nurses.
