While teachers understand teaching and curriculum, you as their parents provide the greatest advice on what each and all students need. This term we have had some student success that I would like to highlight:

- Kijiana Tuatoko (2025 Ministry of Pacific Peoples Toloa Scholarship winner) was interviewed for the Education Gazette on the topic of STEM: Through an environmental lens. This is the Ministry of Education flagship magazine and reaches across the country. This is a massive honor for Kijiana, her inga and community. Congratulations Kijiana we are so proud of you!
- Texas Thompson was awarded a scholarship to attend Outward Bound.

- Our senior students from the 2022 Pacific Studies class, under the guidance of Tiria Tiria, wrote poetry for a book; Pasifika Navigators. This book was released in 2023 and recently won an award for multiculturalism from the Australia and New Zealand Library Association. Great work Mr T and the students.
- Our choir Te Whānau Tahi performed at the 'Big Sing', an event for all the secondary schools in the
  greater Wellington area. They were excellent and a highlight of their performance was their
  acknowledgement of Samoan Language week. They and their families should be very proud, I know I
  was.

I am really looking forward to sharing with you at our community hui and hearing from you, how we can


shape the kura collectively so the waka has a firm direction of travel.


