This term is a very busy one. Winter sports have started and to date we have many students engaged. I want to thank all the parents (taxi/uber service), coaches, managers and volunteers who make it possible for our tamaiti to participate. The music department and senior students kicked off May Music Month with lunchtime concerts and we are blessed to have some quality performances from our students. Kapa Haka is up and running with over 60 students involved. This year we asked students from Hutt Valley High School, Taita College, St Orans and Sacred Heart if they would like to join and make a combined team for Hutt Feast. It is wonderful to see students from all over the Valley coming together to celebrate and take part in a valuable part of their cultural tradition. Our Polynesian club is also up and running to prepare for Hutt Feast. We have over 60 students practicing twice a week. It is inspiring to see the dedication that students are putting into learning dances that reflect their cultural identity. It is Terms like this when our students show we have a rich and vibrant cultural identity and I am proud of our tamaiti.

I would like to acknowledge the passing of Sir Bob Jones (November 1939 to May 2025), a former student of the college. Bob was a businessman, politician and author. Those who met him said that with Sir Bob you took the good with the bad. Extremely generous, he was also outspoken, eccentric and sometimes rude. Jones and his family grew up in state housing in Lower Hutt and he was only one of six students in his year group at Naenae College. After a rocky start to his school years, he found a teacher 'Guy Bliss' who helped influence him to become a high achieving student with an avid love for boxing. Sir Bob Jones credits Guy Bliss with providing him with two very important life lessons – 'always ask questions' and 'everything is interesting'. This caused Sir Bob to devote many hours a day to reading throughout his life. We wish his whanau all the best and hope that he finds eternal peace.

Some important information that I would like to draw to your attention to, a couple of up-and-coming events. It is crucial to ensure that we have your correct contact details, especially your email address and cell phone number, if you have these.

 Enrolment Zone Scheme: We have been advised by the Ministry of Education (MOE) that an enrolment scheme (zone) is to be applied to the college. We have seen significant roll growth over the last few years (from 705 students in 2021 up to our current 831). There are plenty of new building developments in the area and we have become a school of choice in the Hutt Valley. All of this suggests we will soon be at capacity in our classrooms. The MOE will only consider funding extra classrooms for a school with a zone.

"An Enrolment Scheme is a means of preventing overcrowding at a school, ensuring fair and transparent processes are used to determine enrolment eligibility, and enables the Ministry of Education to make best use of the current schools in the surrounding area. Each enrolment scheme for a State school must contain a home zone with clearly defined boundaries.

An enrolment scheme gives students who live in the home zone a guarantee that they can go to that school." MOE

There are many questions still to be answered such as the size of our zone and what the geographic zone will look like. The MOE will soon be reaching out to the community to consult over what this will look like. One of the reasons for your up to date contact details is so that you can receive any relevant news and provide feedback. I want to assure you that this will NOT affect anyone currently enrolled at the college. The target timeline for the zone is for new enrolments from 2026. Also, it is worth noting that ONLY if/when we reach the target student roll will this scheme likely become a factor.


• Board of Trustee's (BOT) Election: This year in September the next BOT elections will be carried out. The details about the process will come out closer to the event. The information and voting process are carried out electronically. This is another reason for your contact details to be up to date with the college. Voting will be carried out via email with a cell phone number required for verification so, we will need both details to be correct. There will be a backup paper-based process for those who do not wish or who are unable to provide these details.

We have Pasifika and Māori community events, Parent Teacher Interviews, Hutt Fest and our own Multicultural Day as well as multiple sports teams, our college drama production, and the choir at 'Big Sing'. 
RED WEEK Monday 19 to Friday 23 May 2025
